Courses

PUP 4004 Public Policy

Col of Arts, Soc Sci and Human, Department of Criminal Justice

3 sh (may not be repeated for credit)

Course focuses on the study of how public policy is made, especially at the national level. Emphasis is on current issues and events including the role of the President, Congress, interest groups, bureaucracy and the public. Materials include extensive use of current news sources in print, television, and internet media.

PUP 4905 Directed Study

PUP 5045 Public Policy Analysis

College of Business, Department of Business Administration

3 sh (may not be repeated for credit)

Examines the issues involved in and methods of developing, implementing, and analyzing public policy. The role of the public manager is assessed relative to other actors in the development of public policy. The graduate course in analytic techniques provides students an opportunity to deepen their understanding of methods of policy analysis and the processes and challenges of implementation. Pre/Co-requisite: None.
